### **HALLETT COVE PARISH VISITATION**

As mentioned in last week's Bulletin the proposed Parish Visitation by the Archbishop and his Team to Hallett Cove Parish in November has now been deferred to next year.

The Visitation will centre on supporting our Parish, School and Communities in the implementation of the eight key characteristics of a healthy, vibrant, renewing parish, and in building supportive collaboration between offices and agencies and local communities in this shared diocesan priority. Through the visitation we will together identify local challenges, discuss solutions and explore how the Diocesan Centre and resources might assist each place. Part of the Archbishop's responsibility is to ensure that all elements of parish life are being led well and that the challenges that parish communities face are being acknowledged and responded to with creativity and commitment. The parish has over past months been involved in asking parishioners to respond to questionnaires about the eight characteristics of renewing parishes. I encourage parishioners to continue to reflect on the challenges that we shall be facing in the future and be prepared for involvement when the Visitation occurs next year at a date to be advised.

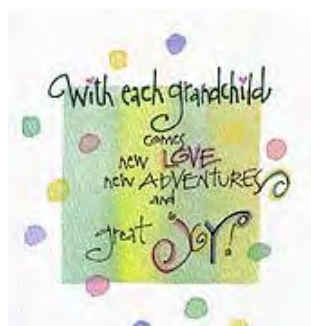

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### International Missions Fund USED POSTAGE STAMPS FOR PERU MISSIONS

Your used stamps can be recycled to help the poor. The Sisters of Mary MacKillop International Missions are carrying out much-needed charity and educational work amongst Peru's poor and youth, giving them an opportunity for education and also to fund training for women to learn useful crafts so that they can earn income.

You can help them to continue this vital good work by collecting any used postage stamps (Australian and International), to be sold to raise funds.

It's simple! Just cut the stamp off, leaving a generous margin of envelope all around the stamp.

The stamps are sold in auctions in Sydney, as well as directly to collectors. The money is then sent to the Mary MacKillop International Missions in Sydney.

In 2016 \$62,000 was raised.

From 2001 up to the present, the total is almost \$186,000.

As the Australian dollar is worth four times in Peru what it is worth in Australia, much can be achieved.

All this is done on a volunteer basis, with no overhead costs, which means every dollar raised can be sent to where it is most needed.

If you would like to save your used stamps and help this worthwhile cause, please drop them into the box on the bench in the church foyer at any time and we will forward them on.
